## PRIVY COUNCIL HELD BY THE QUEEN AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE ON 15 NOVEMBER 2000

2. appropriating the redundant church of Saint Matthew, Moorfields to use for residential purposes, diocese of Bristol;
3. appropriating the redundant church of Saint James in the former parish of Woodhead to use for worship, services and other religious activities in accordance with the objects of the St James Woodland Trusts, diocese of Chester;
4. providing for the preservation and care of the redundant church of St Michael and All Angels, Princetown, diocese of Exeter;
5. Uniting the benefices of Redmarley d’Abitot and Bromsberrow with Pauntley, Upleadon and Oxenhall, of Dymock with Donnington and Kempsey and of Preston, diocese of Gloucester;
6. Uniting the benefices of Northleach with Hampnett and Farmington, of Cold Aston with Notgrove and Turkdean and of Withington and Compton Abdale with Haselton, diocese of Gloucester.
7. dissolving the benefice of Longborough, Sezincote, Condicote and the Swells and creating the new benefices of Longborough with Sezincote, and of Condicote and the Swells, uniting the benefices of Moreton–in–Marsh with Batsford, Todenham and Lower Lemington and of Longborough with Sezincote and uniting the benefices of Stow on the Wold and of Condicote and the Swells, diocese of Gloucester;
8. uniting the benefices of Nailsworth and of Horsley and Newington Bagpath with Kingscote, diocese of Gloucester;
9. appropriating the redundant church of St Peter, Bentham, to use for worship etc in accordance with the rites of the Greek Orthodox Church, diocese of Gloucester;
10. declaring redundant the parish church of St Simon and St Jude, Southport, on the provision of a new place of worship, and providing for the demolition of the old church, diocese of Liverpool;
11. appropriating the redundant church of St Mary, Hulme, Manchester to use for workshop, office and residential purposes, diocese of Manchester;
12. uniting the benefices of Cambois and of Saint John, Sleekburn, diocese of Newcastle;
13. uniting the parishes of Saint James, Newton Hall and of Corbridge with Halton, diocese of Newcastle;
14. terminating the team Ministry for the benefice of Barnham Broom, uniting the benefices of Barnham Broom and of Reymerston with Cranworth, Letton, Southburgh, Whinburgh and Westfield and establishing a new team Ministry for the new benefice, diocese of Norwich;
15. creating the new parishes of Cotterstock and of Tansor, transferring the parish of Southwick to the benefice of Warmington, Tansor with Cotterstock and Fotheringhay (with consequent re–naming), transferring the

patronage of the benefice of Warmington etc to George Christopher Capron, and creating the new benefice of Oundle with Ashton and Benefield with Glapthorn, diocese of Peterborough;

. uniting the benefices of St John, Ovenden and of St Andrew, Holmfild, diocese of Wakefield;
