Fifteen Orders confirming schemes of the Church Commissioners for:–

1. dissolving the benefice of Frome St John and St Mary, creating the new benefices of Frome St John the Baptist and of St Mary the Virgin, Frome, establishing a group ministry for the two new benefices and the benefices of Christ Church and of Holy Trinity, and providing that the new benefice of Frome St John the Baptist and the benefice of St Katharine, Woodlands shall be held in plurality by one incumbent, diocese of Bath and Wells;
2. uniting the parishes of All Saints Weston Super Mare and of St Saviour Weston super Mare, diocese of Bath and Wells;
3. appropriating part of the churchyard of the church of Holy Cross, the parish church of Holy Cross, Billesley Common to use by the parochial church council for any ecclesiastical purpose affecting the parish, diocese of Birmingham;

7. creating the new benefice and parish of North Bersted Holy Cross, diocese of Chichester;

8. appropriating part of the churchyard of St John, the parish church of Shildon, to use for access, open space and garden purposes, diocese of Durham;

9. creating the new benefices of Denbury and uniting it with the benefice of Ipplepen with Torbryan, and uniting the benefices of Wolborough with Newton Abbott and of Ogwell and Denbury, diocese of Exeter;

10. appropriating the redundant church of St John, Beachley to use for community purposes, diocese of Gloucester;

11. terminating plurality for the benefices of Bassingham, of Aubourn with Haddington, of Thurlby with Norton Disney and of Carlton-le-Moorland with Stapleford, and uniting all four benefices, diocese of Lincoln;

12. establishing a group ministry for the benefices of Crosby, of Frodingham, of Gunhouse with Burringham St Barnabas and of The Resurrection, Berkeley, Scunthorpe, diocese of Lincoln;

13. terminating the team ministry for the benefice of St Peter, St Paul and St Philip, Parr, creating the new parishes of St Paul, Blackbrook and of St Philip, Derbyshire Hill and altering the name of the existing parish of St Peter, St Paul and St Philip, Parr to "The Parish of St Peter, Parr", uniting the benefices of Holy Trinity, Parr Mount and of St Peter, St Paul and St Philip, Parr and establishing a team ministry for the new benefice, diocese of Liverpool;

14. appropriating the redundant parish church of Marrick for use for educational, religious and

recreational purposes with a Christian ethos,  
diocese of Ripon and York;

15. appropriating part of the churchyard of St John  
the Divine, Merton, to use as part of a site for a  
parsonage house, diocese of Southwark.
